PABLO PICASSO'S *DON QUIXOTE*

Don Quixote is a 1955 sketch by Pablo Picasso of the Spanish literary hero and his sidekick, Sancho Panza.

It was featured on the August 18–24 issue of the French weekly journal *Les Lettres Françaises* in celebration of the 350th anniversary of the first part of Cervantes's *Don Quixote*.

Made on August 10, 1955, the drawing *Don Quixote* was in a very different style than Picasso's earlier Blue, Rose, and Cubist periods.



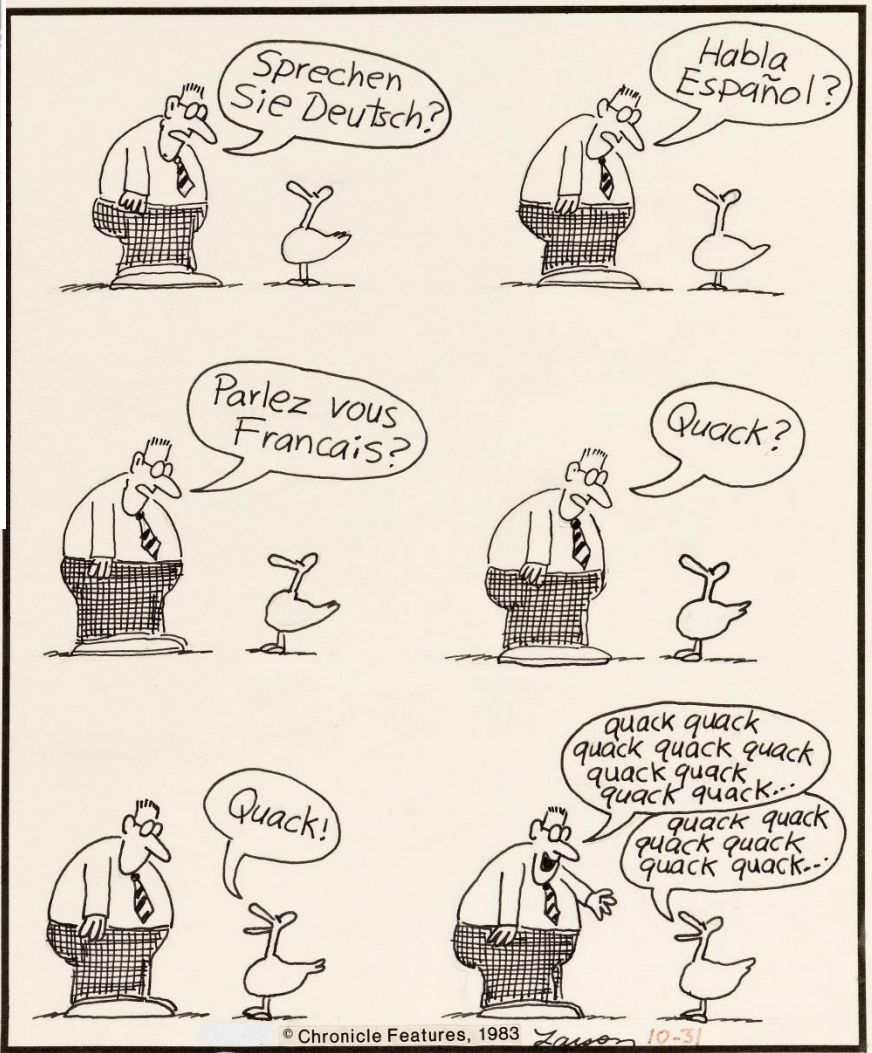
DON QUIXOTE COMIC STRIP

- Using the excerpt you just read from your textbook, your job is to create a 5-6 panel comic strip, focusing specifically on **characterization** and **satire**.
- Your comic strip must include:
 - 5-6 panels, each with **images**, a **caption**, and **word** or **thought bubbles**.
 - You must use **color**
 - You must somehow incorporate the **satirical elements of the excerpt** into your comic strip and make Cervantes' purpose clear. You can do this however you choose, but your understanding needs to be clear.
 - You must also include the accurate **characterization** of Don Quixote & Sancho Panza. How does Cervantes characterize them and why?
